

Information for owners of a vehicle with non-European registration.

Recently the international Bureau of Green Cards informed our underwriters that some countries have decided to change local laws for vehicles with a non-European registration. Upon entering these countries local Customs may force drivers of vehicles with non-European registration to buy local liability insurance in spite of having our insurance and green card. We may, in the near future, be forced to cross out these countries on the green card in order to comply with these local laws, **but so far this is not the case.**

The conditions are as follows:

Valid countries

Our Third Party Liability insurance (**international green card**) is **valid for the following countries:**

Austria (A), Belgium (B), Bulgaria (BG), Cyprus (CY), Czech Republic (CZ), Germany (D), Denmark (DK), Spain (E), Estonia (EST), France (F), Finland (FIN), United Kingdom (GB), Greece (GR), Hungary (H), Croatia (HR), Italy (I), Ireland (IRL), Iceland (IS), Luxemburg (L), Lithuania (LT), Latvia (LV), Malta (M), Norway (N), Netherlands (NL), Portugal (P), Poland (PL), Rumania (RO), Sweden (S), Slovakia (SK), Slovenia (SLO), Switzerland (CH).

Countries that may require local insurance as well

For vehicles with non-European registration Custom authorities at the borders might insist that you buy local insurance in spite of having our green card:

Albania (AL) Andorra (AND), Bosnia Herzegovina (BIH), Belarus (BY), Israel (IL), Iran (IR), Morocco (MA), Moldavia (MD), Former Yugoslav Rep. of Macedonia (MK), Montenegro (MNE), Russia (RUS), Serbia (SRB), Tunisia (TN), Turkey (TR), Ukraine (UA).

This rule does not apply to non-European visitors driving a vehicle registered in any of the EU countries.
